## Floyd Gilbert and Emma Phillips Memorial Scholarship

Floyd Gilbert and Emma Phillips lived in a house at 465 Perry Street in Barry, Illinois for 23-24 years. In this house and community they raised 4 boys and 4 girls, all of whom attended Barry Schools, seven of whom graduated from Barry high School. All of the children at some point in their lives attended institutions of learning beyond the secondary education. Four obtained undergraduate degrees as well as advanced degrees beyond undergraduate.

Upon the passing of Floyd and Emma, The Floyd Gilbert and Emma Phillips Memorial Scholarship was established in their honor to help support quality students who have substantial financial need for the furtherance of their academic endeavors.

The scholarship was initiated to be awarded to a Barry High School senior student who is intending to attend an institution of higher learning after graduation. It was later decided that the eligibility would henceforth be any senior at Barry High School's successor, Western High School. The institution is not necessarily limited to an institution that awards various academic degrees. The student must display good citizenship, be of good character, display financial need, and display reasonable academic scholarship. The student will also be required to submit a typed essay on one of the topics listed below.

The scholarship will be offered in years money is available, expected to be at least \$500. A recipient and an alternate may be selected. The money will be made available the first semester of the students 2<sup>nd</sup> or sophomore year of higher learning. The recipient would be expected to be a full time student in good standing. If neither the recipient nor the alternate remain in good standing for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, the monies will not be released and will remain in the scholarship fund. Money is available in the amount of \$500 for award to a senior in the 2016-2017 school year.

The criteria, in no particular order, that will be considered in the selection process for this scholarship is listed below:

1. Grade Point Average
2. Class Rank
3. Monetary Need
4. Essay
5. Be of Good Character
6. Display Good Citizenship

Essay topics:

1. How growing up in Barry or Pike County helped you become the person that you are today.
2. What your long term goals are and how you would build upon your high school experience to attempt to achieve those goals with emphasis on your experience of being raised in a small town and attending a relatively small high school.
3. Explain why you chose the institute you will be attending, how this relates to your proposed major emphasis of study, and the difficulties you might encounter during your educational journey.
